



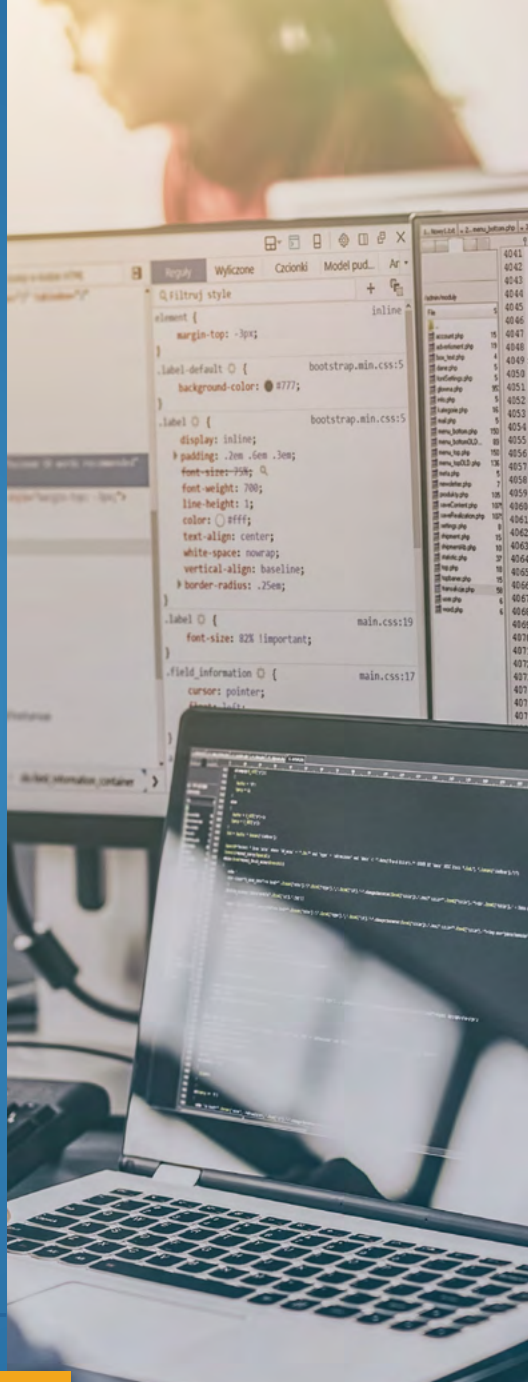

EMTA OBJECTIVES

In one single document, The Euromed Threat Assessment (EMTA) will conduct an in-depth analysis of serious organized crime and terrorist activities in the Euromed area. The EMTA will:

- Facilitate a **coordinated approach to regional cooperation** on the fight against serious organized crime and terrorism, based on well-identified priority areas for increasing citizen security, and in partnership with EUROPOL.
- Strengthen **strategic cooperation** between the Euromed countries, as well as between the Euromed countries and EU Member States and Agencies, by enhancing the **sharing and analysis of strategic criminal intelligence**.
- Help **define operational action plans**, based on the identification of the threats.
- Serve as a **tool for intelligence-led decision making**.

HOW DO WE ACHIEVE THEM?

- By reaching out to a **wide range of law enforcement services**.
- By promoting a **structured and sustainable cooperation** through the establishment of long-lasting mechanisms:

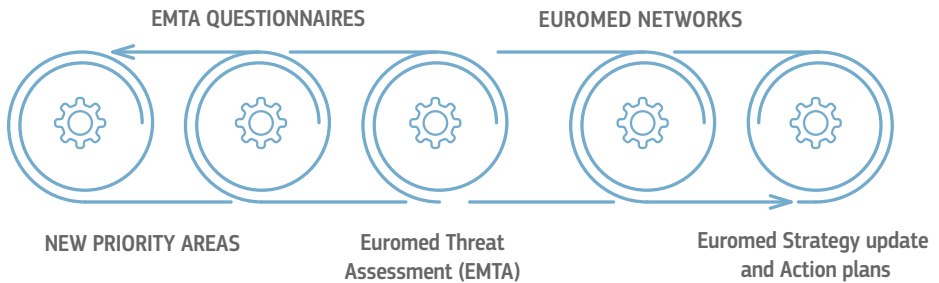
The identification of priority areas in serious organized crime and counter-terrorism and the delivery of tailored capacity building.

OUR METHOD



1 - Threat Assessment and strategic planning

- ➔ Intelligence gaps in terms of organized crime and terrorism are identified by the Euromed Analysis Network.
- ➔ Information is collected in a structured manner.
- ➔ Standardised indicators describe the criminal landscape in all the partner countries.
- ➔ Partner countries provide descriptive analysis and recommendations.

2 - Common priority areas

- ➔ Core priority areas are identified: terrorism & cyber-terrorism, irregular migration supported by criminal networks & trafficking in human beings, cybercrime, firearms trafficking and drug trafficking.
- ➔ Cross-cutting areas are identified: document fraud, financial investigations, money laundering, border controls and criminal analysis.

3 - Tailored capacity building

- ➔ Needs and capacity gaps are identified by the Capacity Building Network and action plans are developed as part of the Euromed Strategy, which is regularly reviewed and updated.
- ➔ Tailored capacity building activities are organised in priority areas for sharing good practices and improving operational efficiency.
