OUR OBJECTIVES



To facilitate a **coordinated approach to regional cooperation**, based on well-identified **priority areas** and the formulation of a **strategy** for increasing citizen security, in partnership with the priorities established by the European Union.



To strengthen **strategic and operational cooperation** between the Euromed countries, as well as between the Euromed countries and EU Member States and Agencies, by enhancing the **sharing and analysis of strategic criminal intelligence.**



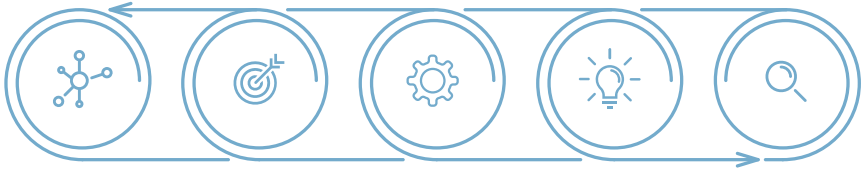
To provide **capacity building** in priority areas, based on the identification of needs and gaps and promote the sharing of existing expertise and good practices.

HOW DO WE ACHIEVE THEM?

We promote **structured and sustainable cooperation** through the establishment of long-lasting mechanisms and processes for a wide range of law enforcement agencies and services.

- **A Euromed Cooperation Strategy** to increase citizen security in priority areas. Most of the current project's priorities are common for both Euromed countries and European countries and are also aligned with the Policy Cycle of the European Union to tackle serious organized crime.
- **A Euromed Threat Forum** for online exchange & analysis of crime intelligence, hosted by **EUROPOL** and managed by the Euromed Strategic Analysis Network.
- The production of the **Euromed Threat Assessment** for the identification of new threats and the development of action plans.
- The provision of **tailored capacity building** in partnership with **CEPOL** for the selected priority areas.
- **A Euromed Knowledge Base** for online exchange of best practices & the development of training materials, hosted by **CEPOL** and managed by the Euromed Capacity Building Network.

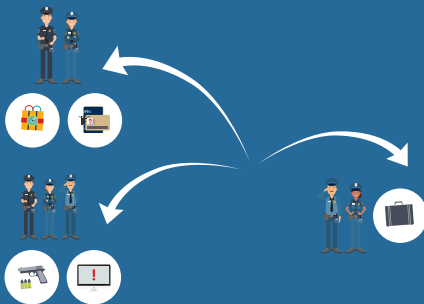

1 - Common priority areas

Core priority areas: terrorism & cyber-terrorism, irregular migration supported by criminal networks & trafficking in human beings, cybercrime, firearms trafficking and drug trafficking.

Cross-cutting areas: document fraud, financial investigations, money laundering, border controls and criminal analysis.



2 - Euromed Threat Assessment

- Identification of intelligence gaps through the **Euromed Threat Forum**.
- **Structured collection** of information.
- Systematic evaluation based on **standardised indicators**.
- Partner countries provide **descriptive analysis and recommendations**.

3 - Tailored capacity building

Tailored capacity building activities are organised in priority areas for sharing good practices and improving operational efficiency.
